# 8<sup>th</sup> Biennial Quilt Bash Quilters in the USA

Your Quilt Bash committee has been hard at work getting all the particulars organized for this upcoming event, slated for May 30-31, June 1-2, 2019, at Simpson University in Redding. To remind you, this event is sponsored by the guild and opened to all quilters both members and nonmembers to attend for the four days of sewing, fellowship, merriment, and so much more. The money we raise will go to the guild's General Fund to help in sponsoring programs/workshops/charitable causes, etc. Pretty much like the money raised from the quilt show.

We will open up the registration on January 1, 2019, for signups. This means both members and nonmembers will be able to sign up at the same time. Here's how it works:

- \* Go to the guild's website at [www.quilterssewciety.org](http://www.quilterssewciety.org) & look for the Quilt Bash icon/page
- \* Click on it & print the application
- \* Send it in along with 50% (or more) of the cost
- \* Make checks out to  
Quilters' Sew-Ciety of Redding, Inc.
- \* Mail to the address stated on the form (this will be Linda Ballard's address)

Who gets in depends on postmark date. Yes, no matter where the quilter lives, she has as good a chance to get in as the local quilters. In other words, don't hesitate! Of course, a waiting list is always kept.

FYI: Last Quilt Bash we filled up in three days. Just the reason not to hesitate. This year's Quilt Bash will cost \$340 per person, which includes lodging in the dorms for three nights, eight meals, sewing area, demos, vendors, and a few more items thrown in. The four days are chalk full of fun activities for you to participate in, or you can just come and sew and rejuvenate yourself. It's all about you, and we want you all to be Happy Campers!

For those who wish to come and participate but wish to go home and sleep in their own beds, we get it. Unfortunately, we cannot give you a break in price.

At Quilt Bash, we have four vendors to cater to us. In the past, only the campers would have access to them and their wares. You might say it was a privilege of being a camper. This Quilt Bash, we're trying something new. We're opening the vendors' room for a small fee and for a limited time to guild members who are not campers. Details to come in December at the General/Christmas meeting as well as in the following months.

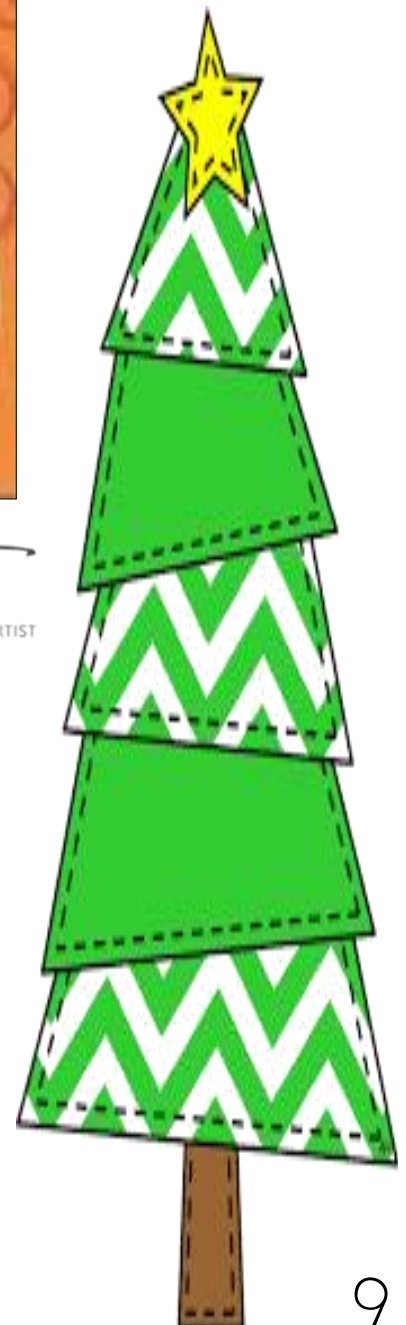
