Philanthropic Quilts

This last month we delivered a total of 65 quilts to our local community. Forty quilts were taken to Mercy Oncology Chemo Center with another 13 quilts being delivered to pediatrics. Another 12 quilts were taken to One Safe Place and we want to give a huge thanks to all of the ladies that helped us with this goal of 65 quilts on the first delivery.

We also want to give thanks to those of you who helped us with our fabric shower. Rest assured that all of the fabric received will be used, if not in the quilts, in our hygiene bags that we deliver to One Safe Place.

A total of 16 fabric kits were taken along with 7 quilts to be quilted. A whopping 40 completed quilts were turned in with 14 top quilts – it seems as though all of the women who attended the Sew In managed to complete their project – Hurray for you! Remember, next month we will not have a table so please save all of your quilts, tops and etc. and bring to the August Meeting. Thank you all for your help.

When delivering the quilts to the outpatient chemo facilities and talking with the patients we have noticed that they prefer quilts that will cover them instead of lap quilts. So when you are creating these wonderful gifts please keep that in mind and think about adding another row of blocks or more borders. The patients genuinely appreciate your efforts.

Quilt sizes to keep in mind - baby 35"x40", crib size 36"x52, throw 50"x65 and twin 70"x90"

Quilts between the throw and twin sizes are appreciated also.

As an FYI I learned something that makes a big difference when making quilts using jelly rolls. Not all jelly rolls are created equal. When they initially came out they were all 2½" wide by the length of the bolt of fabric (measured selvage to selvage). That is not true now as some are slightly wider and some are shorter. Some of the members in the class had to make some adjustments to make their strips fit.

The word quilt comes from the Latin word "culcita," meaning stuffed mattress or cushion. No one is exactly sure when quilting began, but from evidence found in the Temple of Osiris at Abydos, Egypt, it appears people wore quilted clothing as far back as 5000 years ago.

It's Workshop Time Again

This August 8th is our third workshop for the year with an outstanding quilting teacher to show us new and exciting techniques. Quilters' Sew-Ciety of Redding is presenting Victoria Johnson, a Quiltwork-trained and -certified teacher. You will have the option of making placemats or a table runner.

These projects were chosen to show you the technique and to have something completed quickly and not add to your UFO pile for too long. You will be learning the Quiltwork method of paper piecing. Victoria asked that you have your fabrics pre-cut prior to the start of class per the instructions in the pattern envelope.

This workshop will be on August 8th at Sew Simple on Larkspur Lane in Redding. Cost of the workshop, your lunch, and pattern of your choice is \$45.50 for the place mats or 48.50 for the table runner.
