Philanthropic Quilts

Over the last month and a half, our committee and its many helpers have been preparing for the first Carr Fire Quilt Giveaway. Our goal is to distribute a quilt to all of the victims who have lost their homes in the fire. So far, we have over 200 names on our list of those affected and we have gathered a total of nearly 500 quilts. The quilts continue to arrive from various guilds across the United States, including Pennsylvania, Texas, Georgia, North Carolina, Idaho, Oregon and California. We will also be distributing pet beds at the quilt giveaway as well.

The first giveaway will be held at the Lutheran Church on September 15 from 10AM to 2PM and will be by invitation only. If you know of someone who has suffered a loss of their home, please provide Dorinda with the full name of the family, the number of children, names and ages in the family affected and contact information (email or phone) so we can contact them to receive a quilt.

We continue to need assistance with this project, and there are many ways you can help us either by quilting the tops, completing a quilt top, binding and labels, donating fabric for backing, etc. We have also had a request from the Veterans Home in Redding to make 12 small wall hangings to help buffer the noise levels in their cemetery chapel. They would like the quilts to be either 48" by 48" in size or 60" by 60" in size and be made with red, white and blue fabric. If you would like to assist with this project, please let Dorinda know.

Finally, we want to give huge thanks for everyone who donated when we passed the boot last month. With your help we collected a total of \$1,250, which will be used to purchase additional batting, thread and backing fabrics. If you have any questions, we will be at the October meeting and can answer them at our table. Thank you for your help in advance.
