Philanthropic Quilts

This last month our community of Redding and its surrounding areas experienced the greatest natural disaster of the town's history. The Carr Fire has destroyed more than 1000 homes and claimed eight lives. To say that the needs of our community are many and great is an understatement and it will take years to rebuild the lives and homes of those that have suffered from the fire. It is for these reasons that our Philanthropic Committee has shifted its purpose to those affected by the Carr Fire with the goal of providing every family and child with a quilt of their own.

Even as the fires were still raging, the committee was contacted by various guilds across the United States who wanted to help with the donation of quilts to the fire victims. While some of these quilts are completed, many are not and need to be quilted and bound. Also, due to the number of quilts that need to be made, the committee has exceeded its yearly budget and needs to purchase additional batting, thread and fabric for backing.

Instead of providing kits for this month our committee will be asking for your help in the way of a monetary donation to purchase batting, thread and fabric for backing. We will be passing the boot, (or sewing basket) at the meeting for the donations and for those who wish to make a donation that will be tax deductible, please make your checks out to the Redding Quilters Sew-Ciety and include on the bottom that it is for the Carr Fire Relief Fund.

We also have a great need for quilters to assist in quilting of tops, binding and piecing backing along with continuing to make tops for additional quilts. Remember, while many children lost their homes, the greater number was adults so we have a great need for larger (at least queen size) quilts and twin sizes to large throw sizes for children.

Our committee's hope is to distribute the quilts to those victims affected by the fire, but because of privacy laws this will present some issues. So, we are also asking all of our members who know of anyone affected by the fire to provide Dorinda with the full name of the family, the number of children, names and ages in the family affected and contact information (email or phone) in which we can contact them to receive a quilt.

This project will not be completed overnight or even by the end of the year, but with your help and assistance our guild will be able to provide a quilt for all those affected by the Carr Fire. If you have any questions we will be at the September meeting and can answer them at our table or you can contact Dorinda at . Thank you for your help in advance.

What are the Different Types of Quilting?

Pieced Quilts. The Pieced Quilt is the basic all-American quilt you think of when you think of quilting. Blocks are sewn together, pressed, and then sewn into larger rows and columns to create the entire quilt. These are typically quilted with an all-over pattern by hand or machine.

Appliqué Quilts. Typically, appliqué will work its way into any number of styles of quilts. It allows you to use shapes outside of the realm of rectangles, squares, and triangles. There are typically two ways of adding appliqué to a quilt: raw edge and interfaced.

The raw edge technique is typically tracing the outline of the appliqué onto fusible web, peel the back off, stick it to your fabric, and then iron it on. From there you cut out your shape, peel the remaining paper, and stick it onto your quilt and press. This holds it in place while you stitch around the edges. Then you simply sew around all the edges using a blanket stitch, zig zag, or your favorite decorative stitch and viola! Your appliqué is attached!

The interfaced technique works well on larger pieces without sharp angles (like circles) and ensures your appliqué won't fray and will hold its shape. It's very simple: Start by cutting out your fabric and a matching piece of lightweight interfacing. With right sides together, you'll stitch around the edge using $\frac{1}{4}$ seam. Then a snip in the middle of the interfacing allows you to turn it right side out. Press well and place onto your quilt. Now it's time to stitch around the edges to hold everything in place.

Paper Pieced Quilts. Paper piecing allows you to get perfectly crisp points and make some amazing shapes and designs using it. To paper piece, you'll start by printing out templates. It's helpful to think of the printed side of the template as the wrong side and the empty side as the right side of a fabric. Templates come numbered. These numbers are similar to a paint-by-number. You'll start with 1 and work your way up from there. Each line on the template represents where the seam will be. So, after stitching your pieces together (and pressing in between each seam), you'll have a finished block with the seams sandwiched between the paper and the fabric block.
