

August 2024 Signature Block Swap

- 1. <u>Background</u>: A Block Swap is a way for quilters to make and exchange blocks with each other. A coordinator sets the guidelines for the blocks, i.e., design, colors, size, number, etc. Each participant makes blocks according to the guidelines. Then the blocks are swapped among all participants so that each participant collects the same number of blocks that they made.
- 2. <u>August Block Swap</u>: Our August General Meeting Program will be a Signature Block Swap and members sharing Signature Block setting ideas from their own quilts. You will bring Signature Blocks that you made to the meeting. During the meeting the blocks will be divided among the participants. When you leave the meeting, you will have Signature Blocks made by other guild members who participate in the block swap.
- 3. <u>Guidelines</u>: The following are the guidelines for the Block Swap:
 - a. Block: Signatue
 - b. Size: 3-1/2" (3 inch finished)

- c. Colors: White or off-white centers; medium color solid or print for the corner triangles
- d. Design restrictions: Each block will use only two fabrics; no juvenile prints
- e. Number:
- 4. <u>Block Instructions</u>:
 - a. Cut seventy-five (75) 3 ¹/₂" squares of white and one hundred fifty (150) 2-1/2" squares of a medium color.
 - b. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 2 1/2" squares.
 - c. Place a 2-1/2" square on a corner of the white square. Sew on the drawn line and trim 1/4" outside the seam. Press the color fabric out.
 - d. Repeat this with the remaining color square on the opposite corner of the white square.
 - e. Using a permanent fabric pen, sign your name in the white square. Don't forget to iron the ink to set it.
- 5. <u>Requested actions</u>:
 - a. Make 75 signature blocks following the Guidelines and Block Instructions.
 - b. Collect the quilts you have already made using Signature Blocks.
 - c. Bring these items with you to the August General Meeting
